Hi friend,

Thank you for reading this. I feel a deep sense of importance and sacredness as I write each week because I know there are a bunch of you reading this intently. Sometimes the weight of the task causes me to take a long time to say the right things. But these messages have become so important to me and my own spiritual discovery. I really enjoy sending them to you. I am truly blessed by writing them. So I continue, even when it's difficult.

We each have our own personal experiences. You may share the same experiences with your family, friends or others, but deep down, you have your own thoughts and feelings about an experience that is unique to you. Two people can see and hear the same thing, but have a completely different reaction to it.

That means, that no matter how similar you are to someone else, you are still completely unique because of your experience with the world and your inner feelings. You are special. You are completely individual.

This is why it is so wonderful when you tell others about your deep, personal feelings and experiences that you've had with spiritual things. Your spirit and body are so connected it is called your soul. (D&C 88:15; Abraham 5:7) So, the things you feel deep in your soul about what you know to be true, what God's Holy Spirit has communicated with your spirit, is very sacred and special. We call it a testimony.

Today is Fast and Testimony meeting where we traditionally share our testimonies with each other. Thank you for staying faithful during these turbulent times. Building our foundation upon the rock of Jesus Christ, our Savior, is even more important than ever. It will keep us safe, even if it's difficult to do.
