"For a small moment have I forsaken thee; but with great mercies will I gather thee." (Isaiah 54:7)

"And verily I say unto you, I give unto you a sign, that ye may know the time when these things shall be about to take place—that I shall gather in, from their long dispersion, my people, O house of Israel, and shall establish again among them my Zion" (3 Nephi 21:1)

"And that the gathering together upon the land of Zion, and upon her stakes, may be for a defense, and for a refuge from the storm, and from wrath when it shall be poured out without mixture upon the whole earth." (D&C 115:6)

I think you might agree that there's a storm out there in the world today. And everyone needs refuge. The Everett Washington Stake, and specifically, the Penny Creek Ward is a refuge from the storm. Not necessarily because our people are so wonderful (although you are) but it's the restored gospel of Jesus Christ that is the refuge.
