During the pandemic, when we've all been isolated, we've learned how to use our worldly modern technologies and systems to connect and 'be with' each other. Well, here on earth, we're also a bit isolated from God, but he has set up some systems and 'technologies' (if you want to call them that) for us to communicate with Him too. We don't have to know how they work for us to use them (do you really know how your cell phone works? ;)

Prayer is of course, the simplest and easiest way to communicate with our Heavenly Father. We don't know how it works exactly, but if we can get any information in the world from a little device in our pocket, I'm sure our infinite spirit can get messages from its divine parent.
